Control Measures

- New Educators are taught about the safety concerns of the children playing water play, how to correctly supervise.
- Educators are to refer to Flip Chart Blue Tab Medical Emergency, and Emergency Procedures pg 16
 - Safety checklist must be completed prior to children playing on quad area.
 - Educators will decide if the weather is too dangerous for children to be out in.
 - Hazards Eliminated, sectioned off or totally avoided. Maintenance Log in (SIM) and ACI Hazard Report to be completed and forwarded to School Principal.
 - Emergency trolley is to be taken to the area containing the emergency contact list, first aid kit as well as a 4G capable iPad in case of emergency.
 - A current first aid trained staff member must be on site.
 - Educators are to follow WH&S lifting technique when setting up areas or moving equipment.
 - When tables and chairs are used, Educators will ensure the children use them safely and do not climb or stand on top
 - Children are not to swing on bollards (poles on top of stairs in front of OOSH room, stairs opposite OOSH room and stairs leading out of quad area)
 - Children are not to walk along the veranda railings (inside of quad) this is also a school rule
