Control Measures

Covid Precautions

- All Educators to read risk assessment before the face painting activity to understand dangers and safety measures.
- All educator running the face painting activity to brief the children on dangers and safety measure.
- Educators to wipe children's faces prior to painting with a wet wipe.
- After each child, educator will santise the brushes and sponges.
- Change water bowls after each child.
- All staff to actively supervise the use of the paint.
- Children are not to handle the face paint.
- Staff are to clean up any spillages from to prevent any skin irritations from borax and other cleaning products.

Paint on clothes

- Children will be encouraged to wear a paint shirt while their face is being painted.
- Children advise to sit still through the facepainting.
- Water based face paint will be used for easy wash off clothing.

Skin and eye irritations/allergic reactions

- Educators to monitor all children to ensure no irritations, or reactions.
- Low irritant water-based face paint will be used.
- Educator with First Aid qualifications will be roster on the day and will be review procedures for skin and eye irritation.
