#### **Identified Hazard** -

- Trips, Slips, Falls.
- Severe weather/UV.
- Insect stings/bites.
- Falling branches.

- Members of the public/neighbors.
- Car crashing into fence / hitting child/ren
- Improper supervision.

### Hazard / Risk

- Sprains and strains
- #! Cuts, scratches, blisters and Abrasions
- Breaks and Fractures
- # ! Bumps and Bruises
- # ! Sunstroke, Sunburn and Dehydration
- # ! Tripping and slipping, falls
- !! Live wires electrocution
- #! Swelling, pain, itching and rash

#### **Control Measures**

- Staff will be required to read the Emergency Procedures Manual in construction with this Risk Assessment.
- As per our Emergency Procedures Manual and Flip Chart 3.12 Medical Emergency
- Safety checklist must be completed prior to children playing on grass area.
- Educators are to sit children down to discuss rules of the grass area first.
- Hazards Eliminated, sectioned off or totally avoided. Maintenance Log in (SIM) and ACI Hazard Report to be completed and forwarded to School Principal.
- Children are not allowed to play near the fence separating the road and the school.
- Children are only allowed in areas that are in clear vision to the educator.
   Educator is to ensure they discuss the areas open with the children before play.
- Emergency trolley Is to be taken containing the emergency contact list and first aid kit, as well as a 4G capable iPad and service phone in case of emergency. A current first aid trained staff member must be present at the grass area.
- Educators are to ensure children have sunscreen and a hat where the UV is at or above 3 and are wearing appropriate clothing for the temperature.
- Children and educators are to wear enclosed shoes.
- Educators are to supervise children going up and down the stairs and ensure the children aren't running.

# <u>Timeframe for</u> <u>addressing action</u>

 Immediately / as soon as possible

II Grooming/Kidnapping II Death by being hit by a car.	<ul> <li>Educators are to observe the public and ask the public or neighbours to move away, or children will be moved away. E.g. from the fence near the road.</li> <li>Educators will assess weather conditions and decide if it is safe to go to the grass. E.g. extreme heat, rain, hail, windstorm.</li> <li>Educators will ensure they are supervising within their ratio of 1:15.</li> <li>Children are encouraged to take water breaks and spend time in the shade on hot days.</li> <li>Educators supervise following PAT.</li> <li>As per our Emergency Procedures Manual and Flip Chart - 3.17</li> <li>Robbery/Personal Threat</li> <li>Keep still and do not make sudden moves.</li> <li>Do not use phone in perpetrator's presence.</li> <li>Obey perpetrator's instructions.</li> <li>Observe perpetrator's appearance.</li> <li>Allow perpetrator to leave but do not follow.</li> <li>Educators are to ensure children stay in designated playing area and not engage in conversations with strangers.</li> </ul>	- All educators	- Immediately / as soon as possible
